

**Honoka'a High & Intermediate School
School Community Council Minutes
May 15, 2018**

Call to Order at 5:05 p.m.

Principal's Report:

The Western Association of Schools & Colleges (WASC) report was published after their visit in April. The team was impressed by HHIS's culture, climate and interaction with students. The school's alternative programs such as the Alternative Learning Center, Intensive Learning Center and the farm impressed them. They witnessed teacher leaders, professionalism and their commitment to the school.

The WASC team also recommended that the school leadership and teachers continue conversations around rigor in lessons and striving for higher expectations for students in preparation for college and career readiness. The final report will be posted on the Honoka'a High & Intermediate School's website.

Federal Funding - Title 1

The federal dollars allotted for HHIS for the year 2018-19 is \$196,000. The dollar amount is determined based on the number of free and reduced lunch applications that are turned in to the school. The money will be utilized for school support that is based on the school's comprehensive needs assessment. It includes a contract provider to support teachers, teacher stipends for professional development, professional development for teachers and staff, dragon pride initiatives, substitute teachers, an online program for students, PCNC and school supplies. This year the school will be providing a complex wide professional development by Adaptive Schools. The Adaptive Schools Foundation and Advanced Seminars present productive, practical set of ideas and tools for developing collaborative groups in becoming effective and better equipped to resolve complex issues around student learning.

Discussion ensued around the importance of having the proper forms filled out and returned to the school each year as it is directly tied to the amount of federal funding a school receives.

Lokahi services:

Lokahi services will be another service option offered to students in need of additional level of support. Students in need will be assessed and provided anger management classes as determined by Lokahi staff. This service is

offered as a preventative approach to help students with tools to build their coping skills. This service is free for those who have Quest. HMSCA requires minimal copay.

The school team will also reach out to Hamakua Health Behavioral Department to inquire what services they currently have to support students. In addition, Hamakua Health Behavioral staff will have knowledge of the supports the school is providing for students.
